




During the month of March 2016, some 140 residents responded to the New Haven Free Public Library's (NHFPL) online survey, sharing their stories about how the library has made a difference in their lives. From finding a book, movie or music to enjoy and instilling a love of reading in a child to participating in community events and improving their computer skills, respondents selected on average at least three ways in which they rely on the public library, demonstrating NHFPL's multi-faceted impact on local residents.
