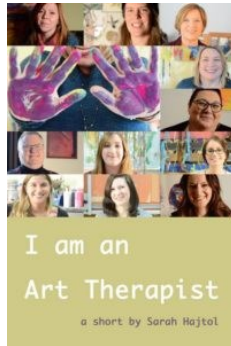

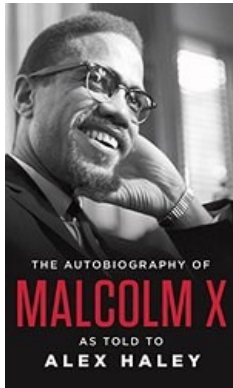

Ageless Beloved: Works by Abbie Rabinowitz

Painting what is personal is a way for Abbie Rabinowitz to tap into the universal. *Ageless Beloved* shows a series of oil paintings completed during her MFA program at Western Connecticut State University in 2015.



Living at home, she chose to paint her parents as her thesis subject since they played such a big part in her daily life. These studies of her elderly parents express the love, intimacy and affection that they still shared for each other in their 90s. Willing to share private moments, her parents were comfortable posing in the nude. The act of posing actually allowed her parents to rekindle their affection. Her paintings are about the experience of intimacy in old age, the acceptance of being cared for and the vulnerability in losing one's independence.
