

Words & Images: A celebration of paintings by Lisa Hess Hesselgrave and the poems they inspired

August – September 6 | IVES Artist's Reception and Poetry Reading: Wednesday, August 24, 5-7pm

On display will be prints of work by Lisa Hess Hesselgrave, and the ekphrastic poems her paintings inspired. Ekphrasis means "description" in Greek. An ekphrastic poem is a vivid description of a scene or, more commonly, a work of art. Through the imaginative act of narrating and reflecting on the "action" of a painting or sculpture, the



poet may amplify and expand its meaning. Pencil and paper will be on hand; we invite viewers to participate with poetry, if inspired to do so.

Thoughts of Ruins | Work by Albert Mortali July 9 – August 27 | MITCHELL

Albert Mortali's work is a layered mixture of paint, paper, and a mélange of repurposed materials including natural elements such as twigs and leaves. Mortali draws artistic inspiration from Homer's Odyssey, the Renaissance, and his coming up in the midst of New Haven's urban renewal. As a New Haven youngster in the 1950s and 1960s, he lived in both the Hill, and Westville. The construction of New Haven's Route 34 changed the lively bustle of Legion Avenue, a frequent haunt of Mortali's teenage crew, as well as the city at large, and in turn altered the patterns of its residents, especially its youth.
