About the Exhibition

On display are prints of work by Lisa Hess Hesselgrave, and the ekphrastic poems her paintings inspired. Ekphrasis means "description" in Greek. An ekphrastic poem is a vivid description of a scene or, more commonly, a work of art. Through the imaginative act of narrating and reflecting on the "action" of a painting or sculpture, the poet may amplify and expand its meaning.

Pencil and paper are available; we invite viewers to participate with poetry, if inspired to do so.

Artist's Statement

Recently Lisa had the unique delight of reading poems that were inspired by several of her paintings. Poet Maureen E. Doallas began a series on the T.S. Poetry Press website TweetSpeak Poetry. More recently, the Golden Thread Gallery in Hartford invited poets to respond to art.
