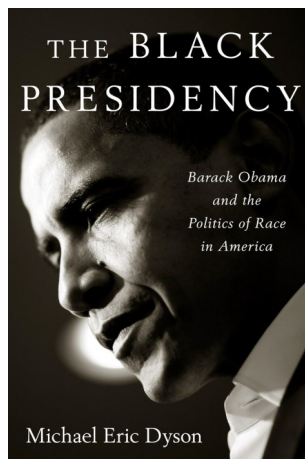

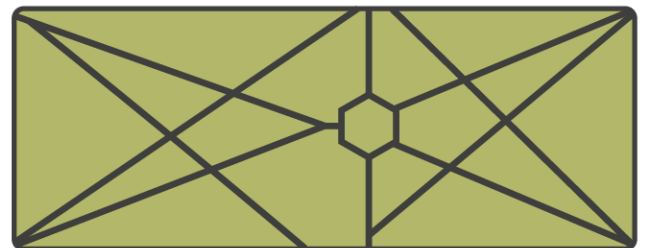

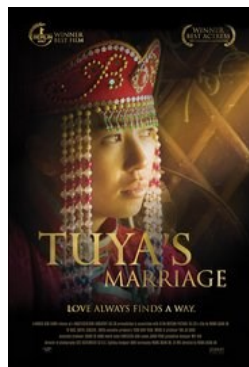
**Glance at the World Through Film**
