

Mitchell Library FACT SHEET

The **Donald G. Mitchell Memorial Library** was founded in 1910, adopted into the New Haven Free Public Library System in 1922, and opened in its current facility in 1966. Situated on the edge of Beecher Park, Mitchell Library has become a cornerstone of the Westville, West Hills and Beaver Hills neighborhoods. Residents frequent the library to attend community meetings, borrow the latest bestsellers, conduct research, or take advantage of the library's free Wi-Fi. Mitchell Library offers a variety of programs for children such as Stay and Play Story Hour, a LEGO-building club after school, and special school vacation week events for older children. For adults and seniors, Mitchell Library offers a variety of topical speakers, author talks and film screenings. Volunteers abound, sharing their skills and talents, including gardening, art exhibits, knitting club, tutoring and English classes for new immigrants. Former President of the Friends of Edgewood Park, the Branch Manager currently serves on the Westville Renaissance Neighborhood Alliance.
