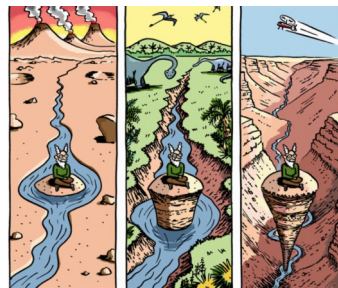


The Zen of Nimbus Comics and Artwork by Michael Sloan
