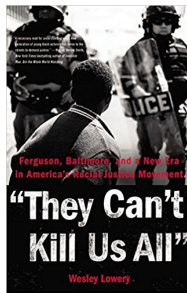

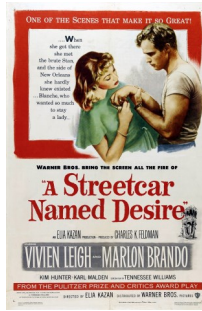

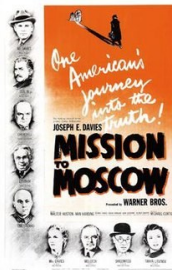
January is all about *A Streetcar Named Desire* in celebration of the 70th anniversary of its premiere at the Shubert Theatre!

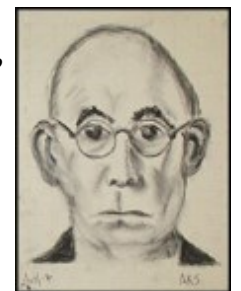
