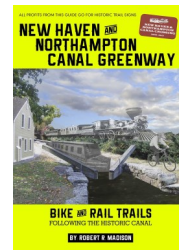
Author Talk & Book Discussion: *New Haven and Northampton Canal Greenway: Bike and Rail Trails Following the Historic Canal* By Robert Madison
