The Ives Gallery is proud to exhibit work that reflects and celebrates the rich diversity of New Haven's cultural community. As a center point of the Lower Level's arts corridor, the Ives Gallery extends from the Information Desk to the new Performance Area, punctuated by a permanent display and sitting area for perusing art books.

The Library was excited to receive proposals from artists and organizations within the greater New Haven community. Proposals were reviewed by a panel of including Kwadwo Adae, Artist, Teacher and Founder of Adae Fine Art Academy; Sharon Lovett-Graff, Branch Manager of the Mitchell Library; David Greco, Co-Founder and Executive Director of Arte, Inc.; and Johnes Ruta, Independent Curator and Art Theorist.

During the review of proposals, panelists considered artistic experience; appropriateness of the work for the Ives Gallery and public community; how the work reflects the diversity of the community and/or provides opportunity for community enrichment or engagement; applicant's readiness for an exhibition; and quality and completeness of the application.
