The Ives Gallery is proud to exhibit work that reflects and celebrates the rich diversity of New Haven's cultural community. As a center point of the Lower Level's arts corridor, the Ives Gallery extends from the Information Desk to the new Performance Area, punctuated by a permanent display and sitting area for perusing art books.

The Library was excited to receive proposals from artists and organizations within the greater New Haven community. Proposals were reviewed by a panel of specialists including Tambira Armmand, former Director of Community Engagement at Artspace; Frank Mitchell, Executive Director and Curator of The Amistad Center for Art & Culture; and Elizabeth Nearing, Community Engagement Manager at Long Wharf Theatre.

During the review of proposals, panelists considered artistic experience; appropriateness of the work for the Ives Gallery and public community; how the work reflects the diversity of the community and/or provides opportunity for community enrichment or engagement; applicant's readiness for an exhibition; and quality and completeness of the application.
