






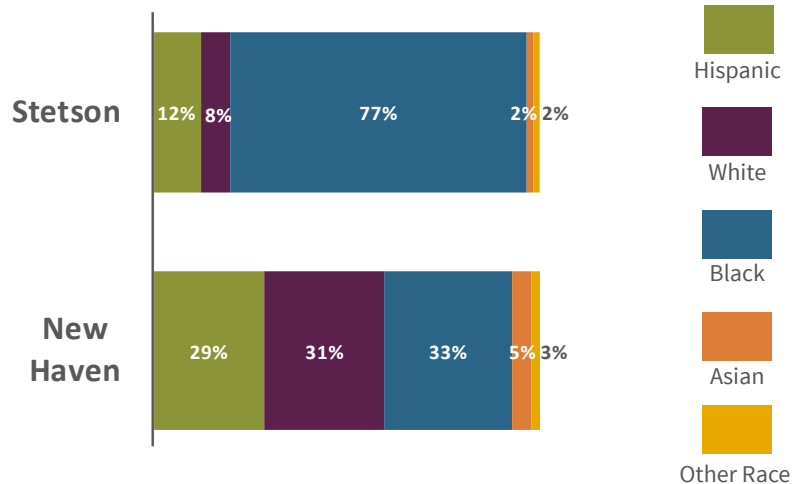

Stetson Library Service District: Demographics and Community Indicators

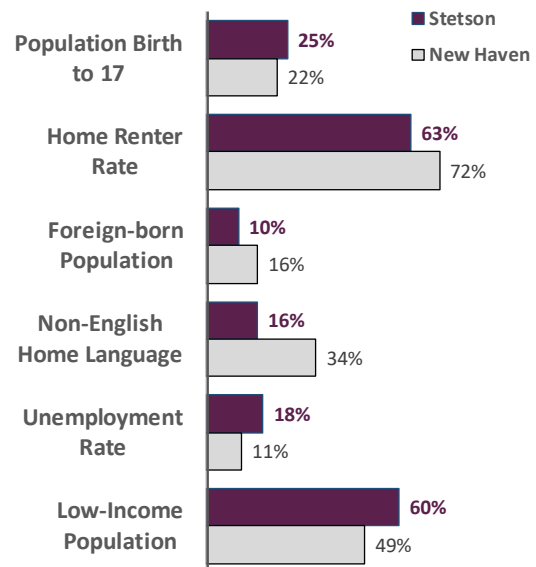

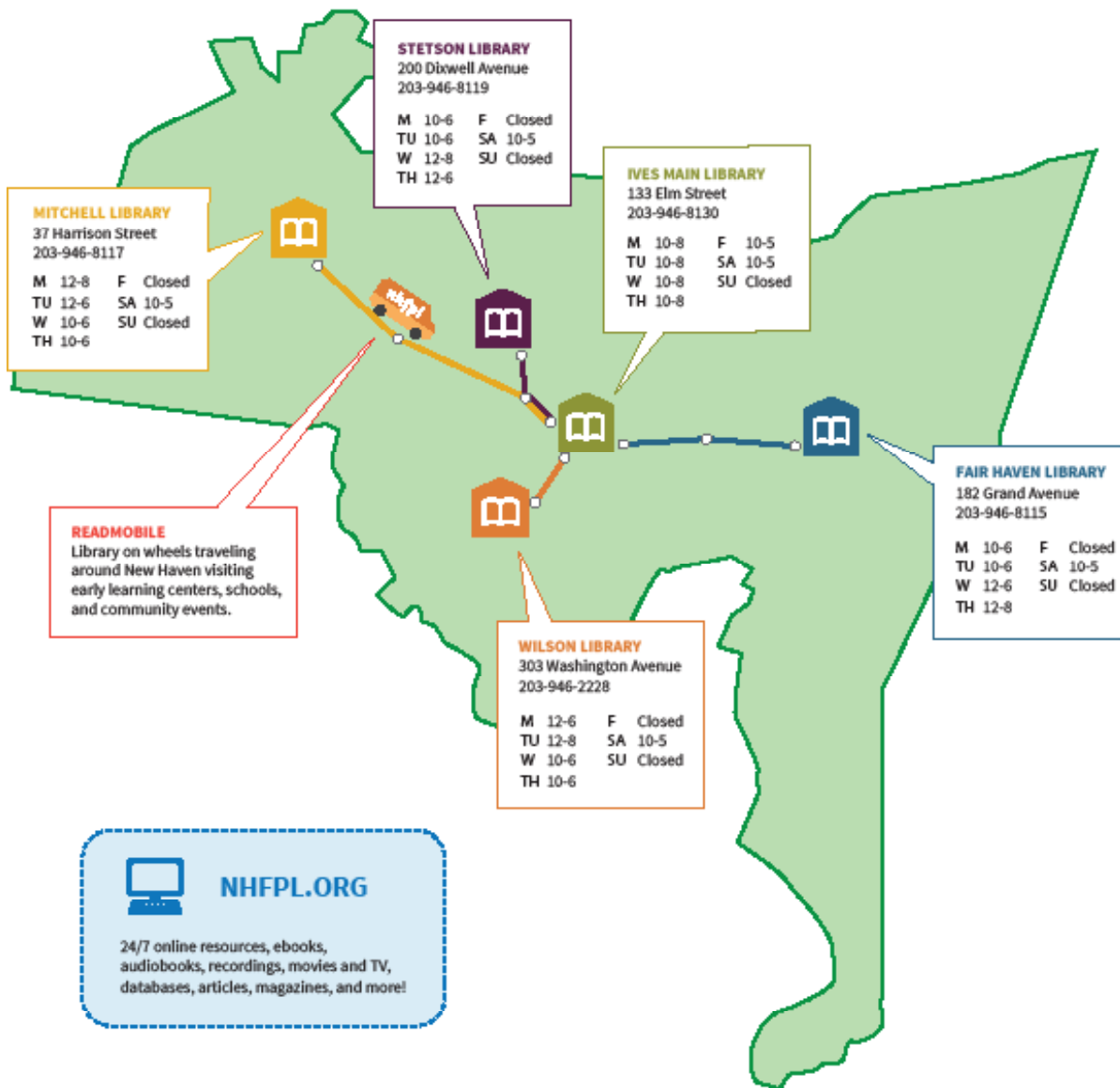
