This exhibition showcases the artwork executed by Adae Fine Art Academy's artists in the past year. Adae Fine Art Academy is a drawing and painting institution located in in the historic Ninth Square district of downtown New Haven. They have been providing individualized instruction to the Greater New Haven area for over 13 years.

Adae Fine Art Academy was founded on the principle that any given artist is driven farther by their own creativity when they work on something they are fully interested in creating. They welcome artist of all ages and provide individual instruction to each student that attends. Students receive an art class specifically catered to their own interests, skill

level, and creative needs. This style of instructions allows each student to work on what they are enthusiastic about and further their personal artistic passions. Adae Fine Arts Academy also runs a Mobile Art Studio from which they can hold art classes almost anywhere, sharing their inspired instruction outside the walls of the school.
