Read to Grow distributes the NHFPL cards and accompanying bilingual postcards explaining easy ways to use them for expecting parents. Pregnant women who are residents of New Haven and receive obstetrical care at Cornell-Scott Hill Health Center, Fair Haven Community Health Center, and Women's Center at Yale New Haven Primary Care Clinic will receive the cards. Each library card is valid for at least one year and offers access to online resources at NHFPL, including e-books, music and videos. Each postcard includes the five NHFPL locations and contact information, along with encouragement for adults to visit their favorite library branch and upgrade their cards to full-service library cards.
