Call for Applications for Entrepreneur-In-Residence and Creative-In-Residence **Submission Deadline: August 20, 2020**

NEW HAVEN – The New Haven Free Public Library, an anchor institution of the New Haven Innovation Collaborative, seeks applications for two nine-month in-residence opportunities, starting October 2020 in Ives Squared, the main library’s innovation commons. The two in-residence appointments are:

- **Entrepreneur-In-Residence (EIR).** The EIR embodies the spirit of innovation and the transference of practical information. The EIR might share their skills by initiating workshops and classes (drawing upon their personal knowledge or their professional network); conducting one-on-one sessions to guide emerging entrepreneurs in the development/launch of their concepts; and creating an active community of inquisitive professionals.
- **Creative-In-Residence (CIR).** The CIR helps connect library users to local creatives, artists and makers with the New Haven community. The CIR will bring the Ives Squared Tinker Lab makerspace to life -- sharing their skills and knowledge by initiating workshops and classes (drawing upon their personal knowledge or their professional network); exploring ideas in a public context; and creating a collective project.
