Technology Center Open by Appointment at Ives Main Library

NEW HAVEN – The New Haven Free Public Library (NHFPL) is pleased to announce that it has opened the Technology Center at the Ives Main Library at 133 Elm Street in New Haven for one-hour computer appointments during the hours of 10 am – 5 pm, Monday through Friday.

Guidelines for Using the Technology Center

- Face masks must be worn at all times while visiting the library.
- Social distance of at least 6 feet must be maintained.
- Hand sanitizer is available for use upon entering the library.
- Computer appointments are for one hour.
- Each person is allowed to make one appointment per day and allowed to schedule one appointment at a time.
- Computer appointments are available for ages 13 and above. No children are allowed in the library at this time.
- Staff are able to provide limited assistance using a remote program from the service desk and from a safe, social distance.
- No other areas of the building will be open to the public at this time.

Please note, the Technology Center will be closed for Primary Day voting on Tuesday, August 11, 2020.
